- The CE building has sold! The closing date is 4/30. The purchase price was \$70,000 with the concession of 2 parking spaces in the previously grassed area along the alley. We will also be sharing the rear entrance with the buyers. Thank you to everyone who helped move or dispose of all the items in the building!
- Session is deliberating whether or not to take out the 10-15 year, 0% interest loan from the city for the steam conversion.

  There are benefits to having those funds available for an extended period of time, although if we don't take out the loan we can get a rebate of 75% of our 2023 steam costs, which would equal over \$4,000.

#### **A Note from Session**

Session felt it was important to note a couple things about the selling of the Christian Education building. First, they would like to thank everyone who has been involved with this long process. The process began in July 2023 when the Support Committee first suggested moving forward with the sale in order to use the funds to keep the church going as long as possible. From there, the decision to put the building up for sale needed approval from Session and then the congregation at the December congregational meeting. After approval was granted, the Presbytery granted approval in February 2024 to authorize the formation of the Administrative Commission that would make the final decision to sell the building. The commission met in March and a listing contract was signed in May. After the price was lowered a couple times, the HCPC Task Force was formed in January 2025 and helped facilitate another price reduction which led to accepting an offer and finally moving out of the building. Again, thank you to all involved throughout this whole process!

A second thing to emphasize is that the funds from the sale of the building were originally intended to keep the church going longer. They were not intended to be used for the steam conversion. If the funds were used for that purpose, there would not be much left over to keep the church open much longer. The results from the questionnaire from the December congregational meeting indicated that people

were willing to contribute to a capital campaign adequately enough to cover the expected costs of the steam conversion. It was because of this that Session agreed to move ahead with the steam conversion and plan on keeping the church building. Session would like to make it clear that, even though we sold the CE building, a fundraising campaign will still be necessary to fund the steam conversion. The Task Force will be developing a fundraising plan, and Session hopes that everyone considers doing their part so that we can continue to worship together in our historic church building!

#### **HCPC Task Force Report**

- The Presbytery has approved our loan applications with the City of Virginia for nointerest loans for the steam conversion of both the Church and the CE Building. (The one for the CE Building will hold funds available for the buyers, if they request them.)
- The paperwork for the sale of the CE Building is progressing and the hope is that the closing will be April 30. As part of the agreement, the buyers will take care of the steam conversion of that building and the church will be obligated to provide 2 dedicated parking spaces behind the church building for the buyers.
- The address change for the CE Building to 210 ½ 5th Ave. S. is official, so a new mail box will be installed for the church, which will remain 212 5th Ave. S.
- Due to the sale of the CE Building and the projected closing date of April 30, the Task Force dedicated the month of March to emptying out the CE Building and moving the office over to the church. Needless to say, it was a HUGE project! Several work days were held and a dedicated, hardworking crew showed up. Many thanks to those who helped with the cleaning and moving! 
